- A. VB scanning session: Last session will be held 11/21, Student Center, room K302, 3:00 – 4:30 pm. Session will focus on “What impacts our ability to function both internal and external to the institution”? Overall themes include looking at program efficiency and identifying critical institutional processes that need improvement.

- A. College-Wide Senate: Nov 7th at the Norfolk Campus

- Motioned and approved. The college hire an outside firm to conduct a salary compression study

Met on Nov 1st. Nov 15th meeting was cancelled. On the agenda: 1) future AC meeting dates, 2) Transfer VA update, and 3) Direct Placement presentation given by Kyndra Brown.

- C. VB Provost’s Staff Meeting

Nov 5th, Nov 19th

1. Fall Enrollment as of this week Tuesday:

VB -7.2% Ches -7.5% Norfolk -11.9% Ports -10.4% College -8.7%

2. Spring Enrollment as of this week Tuesday

VB -12.4% Ches -11.6% Norfolk -18.0% Ports -20.8% College -15.0%

3. VCCS student email initial access changed: Effective Feb. 2020 student email will not be turned on until student enrolls in class. This is in response to incidence of fraud.
4. ATMs eliminated on campus as cost is \$14,100 per year. Only 2 machines and each has been used 111 and 191 times respectively. Comment was that's like a cost of \$70 per transaction.
5. SIS update. No choice, we will be losing support (Have to update or lose technical support).
6. Online VA network includes 5 VCCS colleges (TCC is one) – offers 22 degrees online. Could have some financial repercussions due to FTE allocation. Bachelor's degree being offered from ODU and George Mason.
7. Lumina Grant" All Experience Counts" to systemize turning experience and earned certificates into college course credit
8. "get a job and give back"
Level 1 for CSC → Level 2 for Certificate → Level 3 Associates Degree → Job. Hiring of "coaches" vs counselors. Student to advisor ratio for VCCS is 548:1. Nationally recommended 300:1 and FYI at TCC It's 1200:1. Three outreach advisors being hired with one going to Va. Beach.
9. VCCS is asking the general assembly for 2% increase for faculty & staff salaries for each of the next two budget years.
10. TCC Community Day well attended for a rainy Friday night. Estimate of 85 to a couple hundred people attended a movie in Pungo Bldg. about "for profit colleges", Science Bldg. for a planetarium show and various activities. "It was more interesting than the usual someone sitting at a table with flyers". Entertainment, art and Russian food.
11. Incorrect programming of MTE1-3 courses in SIS. Apparently taking any one of the MTE1, MTE2, or MTE3 allowed students to sign up for MTE5.
