

## VIRGINIA BEACH CAMPUS

The campus was established in temporary quarters on Camp Pendleton, a state military reservation, in 1971. It opened in fall of 1974 as a permanent campus, constructed on 115 acres off Princess Anne Road. Each of the buildings is named for a borough of Virginia Beach – Princess Anne, Bayside, Blackwater, Kempsville, Pungo, Lynnhaven and Virginia Beach. The Advanced Technology Center (ATC) opened at the end of 2002; it is a cooperative venture and partnership between the City of Virginia Beach, The Virginia Beach Public Schools, and TCC. The Science Building, opened in spring 2008, is a 70,000 square-foot building featuring a 90-seat planetarium, an outside “living laboratory”, an oceanography lab with a 30-foot wave tank, anatomy and physiology labs, a greenhouse, and an observatory. In 2011, the Regional Health Professions Center opened—a 65,000 square-foot facility providing clinical learning in simulated medical settings. In 2013-14, a \$43 million Joint-Use Library, funded by both TCC and the City of Virginia Beach, opened on the campus, and the largest of four campus student centers opened as well.
