### V. Open business

# A. SCHEV Policy on Assessment

- Jennifer Ferguson provided an overview on the policy and current status.
- SCHEV's Assessment Policy was approved in July of 2017.
- Four competencies are required to be assessed across the VCCS: Quantitative Reasoning, Written Communication, Critical Thinking, and Civic Engagement (new). Two additional competencies will be supported and determined by the VCCS.
- An ongoing discussion is occurring to determine next steps.

- It was mentioned that the GEC could draft a statement about how Civic Engagement could be addressed and assessed.
- A timeline for implementation of these competencies has not been determined.

### A. Election of Officers

# **B.** Committee Charges

- The Committee reviewed the below charges proposed by Dr. DeMarte.
  - Review and recommend any revisions to policies, procedures, plans, or other relevant documents that are germane to the purpose of the General Education Task Force; assist in drafting new policy and procedures, if needed.
  - o Implement general education course selection procedures.
  - o Participate in focused discussion(s) regarding general education assessment results with faculty and academic deans each semester.
    - Note: The Committee discussed whether this charge was more appropriate for the Instruction Committee.
  - As part of advancing Guided Pathways redefine general education.
    - Note: The Committee suggested combining this charge with the below charge.
  - O Determine the committee's role in advancing Guided Pathways: Develop criteria (e.g., transferability, enrollment trends, college-wide offerings/implications for other programs) and a review process to narrow the list of general education choices (e.g., 5 to 7 courses in Humanities, Social Sciences, etc.); the remaining gen education courses do not have to go away.
    - Note: The Committee suggested combining this charge with the above charge.

## C. Instruction/Curriculum handbooks

• The GEC should determine where conflicting language is found related to general education.

## D. HUM 220 Proposal

- Dr. Leah Hagedorn (N) and Dr. Jennifer Dixon-McKnight (N) submitted a proposal to have HUM 220-Introduction to African American Studies added to the list of general education courses.
- Guided by the seven established criteria, GEC members will review the packet and discuss at the next meeting.
